





WELCOME TO LIME LAKE!

Lime Lake, popular fishing, swimming and boating resort, lies in the foothills of the Allegheny Mountains, in the northeast corner of the Town of Machias, Cattaraugus County. It is 1200 feet above sea level and covers approximately 500 acres. The lake was named because of shell lime deposits on its bottom.

Fed entirely by springs, it is an artificial lake, originally consisting of three ponds. It was dammed up at the north end about 1839 to provide water power for a feed and saw mill and has two outlets, one at the north under the Old Mill Roller Rink and one at the south. Its waters eventually empty into the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean since the northern outlet flows into Cattaraugus Creek on into Lake Erie and the southern outlet into Ischua Creek south to the Allegany River.

First settlement at Lime Lake was in 1813 and today several families and businesses make up Lime Lake hamlet, a year around residence. The first school house, a log structure, was built in 1819; the first saw mill in 1823 by Andrew McBizzell; the first grist mill in 1823 by David Potter. Howard Peck and Alva Jefferson operated the first store in the locality and the first inn was run by a Widow Freeman in 1820. The only woolen mills ever to exist in the Town of Machias were run by Follett and Colgrove at Lime Lake about 1835. These mills operated day and night with people coming from distant places and camping out and waiting to have their work done.

The lake's water power enabled a flour and grist mill, operated by Jacob Wurst and John E. Euchner, to flourish in 1874 and 1875. Years later the Queen City Milk Company used lake water power to operate a modern milk plant here. Its building is now the Old Mill Roller Skating rink operated by Leo N. Beardsley.

Lime Lake also served as a great source of ice before electric refrigeration and the manufacture of artificial ice. The first ice house was built about 1880 by Newton and Armstrong for the Webster Ice Company of Buffalo. It was destroyed by fire. A second ice house was built by W. L. Markham and a third by the Citizens Ice Company of Buffalo, on the site now occupied by the pavilion, at the park here about 1888. Three more ice houses were built by the Webster Ice Company in 1890, 1892 and 1896 so that the total capacity of the ice harvest per year was approximately 145,000 tons. These ice houses were later razed when the electric age came on.

The Odosagih Bible Conference Grounds on the southwest shore of Lime Lake were once Hazelmere Park. There the famous old Hazelmere Hotel stood on high ground until destroyed by fire. The park was not used for many years until a dance hall was constructed by Earl Pratt. The Odosagih Bible Conference Association purchased the dance hall and park and has since held meetings and conferences there. They continually improve and add to their grounds. Several cottages now line their shore. (See Page 43)

Lime Lake has grown in popularity steadily. It is stocked with fish each year by the New York State Conservation Department through the cooperation of local residents, the Franklinville Conservation Club and the Kiwanis Club of Delevan-Machias.

The Pennsylvania Railroad runs along the east shore of the lake and crosses the Baltimore and Ohio about a half mile south of the lake at Machias Junction.

Cottage owners who wish to rent their cottages for any period during the season may now register their name, cottage number, home address, telephone number and other information with R. J. Wieloszynski, Box 97, Machias, N.Y. A registry will facilitate the answering of inquiries and may enable cottages to have a year 'round local representative for rental service.

Any owner whose property is available for any period of a week or more this season or next, is invited to register such information with the Rental Registry.

All information supplied by owners will be confidential. When an inquiry is received for a specific week or month, the owner who is registered with the registry as having his cottage available for that period will be contacted. Only when the owner agrees will the information be forwarded to the applicant. If no cottage is registered for the period requested, the inquiry will be answered "none available."

MACHIAS, New York

The Town of Machias is located on elevated tableland between the waters of the Allegheny River and Cattaraugus Creek. Its soil is a clay and gravel loam suitable for cereal and stock raising. Cheese making, once a major industry, died out several years ago and today the town is primarily a dairy farming community. Many of its farms produce pure maple syrup used throughout the nation.

Population of Machias is 1,341 (1950 Census) and its principal industry is gravel and sand mixing. Two major companies, the Olean Gravel Co. and the Buffalo Slag Co., Inc., ship hundreds of tons of mixed gravel from huge pits in Machias.

The village was originally known as Machias Five Corners, or Chickasaw and was a stopping place for teamsters and travelers on the road between Olean and Buffalo. Major Timothy Butler was the first resident, coming here with his family from Machias, Maine in 1813. He built a distillery and manufactured rum from maple syrup. Increased settlement and the development of last block factories, cheese plants, ice houses and mills near Lime Lake made a flourishing community.

The old burial ground was located one mile north of Machias village and named Brewer Cemetery. About 50 years later the present Maple Grove Cemetery was established. It lies a half mile west of the village on School Street, shaded by trees. A still older cemetery than the Brewer Cemetery existed until a few years ago. It is in the Gulf District, so was known as Gulf Cemetery. The remains of old Revolutionary soldiers buried there were interred in the newer Maple Grove Cemetery in a Memorial Day ceremony in 1940.

Amerilla Brown was mistress of the first schoolhouse in Machias built in 1827 a mile north of the village. It burned down in 1830. About 1900 a new school was built on the present site of the newer part of the school now standing, but in 1913 this, too, burned down. The very next year it was rebuilt and stands today with an addition made in 1935. It is part of the Delevan-Machias Central School system and includes a two-classroom annex in a store in the village. George Crawford is principal.

In 1827, too, the first Post Office was established here with Joseph Kinne Jr. as postmaster. Today's postmaster is Frank G. Zarabski.

Machias was chosen for the site of the Cattaraugus County Farms and Welfare Home for the Aged. Buildings were erected at the present location in 1835. The original wood building burned but the Napiers built the stone building in 1868. It still stands and can be seen from the lake.

First religious sect founded in the town was the Free Will Baptist. Today there are five churches in the town—Machias Methodist, First Christian, Machias Wesleyan Methodist, St. Christopher and Holy Family Catholic. All hold services every Sunday.

The Methodist church was organized in 1822 with five members. Meetings were first held in the schoolhouse. In 1839 the Methodists, Christians and entire community jointly built the present First Christian Church (known as Congregational-Christian). The Methodists broke away and erected their own church in 1853.

The First Congregational-Christian Church was established in 1827 by Joseph Bartlett, and it also had five members to begin with.

Third church organized here was the Wesleyan Methodist in 1888 by the Rev. B. F. McLaughlin.

St. Christopher Catholic church was the fourth in the town, built by cottage owners in 1941 at the north end of the lake. First services started in July.

Holy Family Church was built under the direction of the Missionary Apostolate at the corner of Route 16 and Franklin Street, with construction starting in October 1951. First Mass was held June 22, 1952 when the church was dedicated. A new parish hall and rectory was built in 1954 and dedicated October 17.

George A. Stoneman was the first commander of the Phillips Post No. 329, G.A.R., founded in 1883 by Col. W. H. Hicks of Arcade. All those veterans are deceased.

Urania Lodge No. 810, F. & A.M., was established in 1894 with William A. Joslyn the first master. The building was erected in 1894 by D. S. Tilden, his son and Dr. Clarence King.

The Glenn A. Pratt Jr. American Legion Post No. 1460, Inc. has its own club, formerly the G.A.R. building. William O'Connell is commander.

The Pennsylvania Railroad enters Machias from Buffalo near the northeast corner and runs nearly straight south, crossing the Baltimore and Ohio at Machias Junction. The Junction was once the larger village and a post office was established, but on June 29, 1940 it was removed and now mail is delivered there by a route from Machias.

Another shipping point of some importance in Machias was called Summit Station in the southwestern part of the town on the Rochester branch of the old Buffalo, Rochester and Pittsburgh Railroad. It contained some stores, a schoolhouse and about a dozen dwellings. Today only a few of the original buildings remain.

The entire township in 1817 had a population of 11 families.

Today the township is governed by a town board with the supervisor, August E. Herman, presiding officer. The village is unincorporated, thus the township, which includes Lime Lake, has jurisdiction over the municipal affairs of the town, roads and lake.

The many fine home locations in the rolling hills surrounding Lime Lake add to the pleasure of this resort area, which in winter draws many hunters and sportsmen for recreation.

The Town of Machias extends to you a hearty welcome and wish for a pleasant and memorable stay here.



Standard Technique For Arm Lift Method Of Artificial Respiration

Position of the subject

Place the subject in the face down, prone position. Bend his elbows and place the hands one upon the other. Turn his face to one side, placing the cheek upon his hands.

1. Position of the operator

Kneel on either the right or left knee at the head of the subject facing him. Place the knee at the side of the subject's head close to the forearm. Place the opposite foot near the elbow. If it is more comfortable, kneel upon both knees, one on either side of the subject's head. Place your hands upon the flat of the subject's back in such a way that the heels lie just below a line running between the armpits. With the tips of the thumbs just touching, spread the fingers downward and outward.

2. Compression phase

Rock forward until the arms are approximately vertical and allow the weight of the upper part of your body to exert slow, steady, even pressure downward upon the hands. This forces air out of the lungs. Your elbows should be kept straight and the pressure exerted almost directly downward on the back.

3. Position for expansion phase

Release the pressure, avoiding a final thrust, and commence to rock slowly backward. Place your hands upon the subject's arms just above his elbows.


4. Expansion phase

Draw his arms upward and toward you. Apply just enough lift to feel resistance and tension at the subject's shoulders. Do not bend your elbows, and as you rock backward the subject's arms will be drawn toward you. Then lower the arms to the ground. This completes the full cycle. The arm lift expands the chest by pulling on the chest muscles, arching the back, and relieving the weight on the chest.

The cycle should be repeated 12 times per minute at a steady, uniform rate. The compression and expansion phases should occupy about equal time; The release periods being of minimum duration.

Additional related direction:

It is all-important that artificial respiration, when needed, be started quickly. There should be a slight inclination of the body in such a way that fluid drains better from the respiratory passage. The head of the subject should be extended, not flexed forward, and the chin should not sag lest obstruction of the respiratory passages occur. A check should be made to ascertain that the tongue or foreign objects are not obstructing the passages. These aspects can be cared for when placing the subject into position or shortly thereafter, between cycles. A smooth rhythm in performing artificial respiration is desirable, but split-second timing is not essential. Shock should receive adequate attention, and the subject should remain recumbent after resuscitation until seen by a physician or until recovery seems assured.

PUBLIC ORDINANCE

Ordinance of the Town of Machias relating to speed
and operation of boats on Lime Lake

SECTION NO. I

Definitions:

1. Boats shall mean any floating craft except diving rafts, and shall belong to one of the following classes:
 - (a) Motor boats shall include every boat propelled in any manner other than by hand, feet or by wind.
 - (b) Any floating craft not enumerated in above.
2. Owner shall mean the person actually holding the title to a boat.
3. Operator shall mean individual who operates or navigates a boat.
4. Under way shall mean that the boat is not at anchor, made fast to the shore or aground.
5. Starboard shall mean the right side, facing the bow of the boat.
6. Port shall mean the left side, facing the bow of the boat.

SECTION NO. II

Regulations:

1. The owner of each boat which will operate on the waters of Lime Lake shall file an application for the registry with the Town Clerk, on a form provided by him. The application shall state the dimensions of the boat, type of power unit and other data, which the Board considers essential for complete identification of the boat. The application shall be signed by the owner of the boat with verification of his ownership. Upon receipt of the application in approved form the Town Clerk will enter the same on the records of his office and issue a certificate of registration, stating the number assigned to him. The owner shall paint on or attach to each side of the bow of the boat the identification

number in such position as to be displayed in a conspicuous manner with figures and letters at least four inches in height, and not less than one-half inch in width: white on all but white boats and black to be used on white boats. In case of a boat carrying Federal License number, color contrasting to the boat will be used to underline the number, giving it a Lime Lake identification mark.

2. The Town Clerk is authorized and empowered to grant licenses upon the payment of \$1.00 annual fee for each boat registered for the calendar year from January 1 to December 31. Licenses will not be issued from 12:00 Noon Saturday until Monday 9:00 A.M.

3. Every operator of a motor boat shall at all times navigate the same in a careful and prudent manner and at such rate of speed as not to endanger the property of another or the life or limb of any person. Reckless navigation of a motor boat shall include operating the same in a manner which unnecessarily interferes with the free and proper use of the waters of Lime Lake, or unnecessarily endangering other boats therein or the life or limb of any person. Every motor boat approaching or passing any other boat or bathing beach shall be slowed down to a speed that will cause no damage to the occupants of such other boat or bathing beach. No motor boat shall be operated within 100 feet of shore at a speed exceeding (5) miles per hour.

4. The exhaust of every internal combustion engine used on any motor boat on the waters of Lime Lake shall be effectively muffled by equipment so constructed and used to muffle the noise of the exhaust in a reasonable manner. The use of cut-out and sirens is prohibited.

5. Every motor boat in excess of five horsepower shall have life preservers, life belts or buoyant cushions which shall be in sufficient numbers to provide safety for those on board. No boat, canoe or other craft shall be loaded to more than its seating capacity. Each boat shall have no less than four inches of space from gunwale to the water, however the enforcement officer shall have

the authority to order off the lake any over-loaded boat at his discretion.

6. Every boat when under way, or while at rest, as used for fishing upon the waters of Lime Lake during the hours from sunset to sunrise shall carry a white light aft to show all around the horizon.

7. Proper signs setting forth the above regulations and whom to notify in case of disturbance or accident shall be posted at the boat liveries operating on the lake, in each cottage and at other places of lake entry as may be necessary to enlighten visitors.

8. Any operator of a boat will be held responsible for any violation of this ordinance.

9. Any violation of this ordinance shall be an infraction punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50.00 or 30 days imprisonment, or both, and/or license may be revoked or suspended.

SECTION NO. III

Issuance of Summons and Procedures Thereon

1. Upon violation of any of the provisions of Section II of these ordinances of the Town of Machias, either within or without his presence, any constable, Sheriff or Deputy Sheriff of the County of Cattaraugus, is hereby authorized to issue summonses in the following form, the blanks to be filled in by the officer as the case may be:





This photo of Lime Lake, from the hill northeast, emphasizes the beauty of the rolling hillsides and farmland surrounding this vacation resort. The village of Machias is at the rear, far right in the photo. New York State Highway 16 comes into the village and curves behind the line of dark trees across the lake, continuing off to the left toward the village of Franklinville.

Four of Lime Lake's prominent bays, "happy fishing ground" for all anglers, are shown, as well as the mile-long expanse, left to right of this spring-fed lake, playground for boating. The single track of the Pennsylvania Railroad, Buffalo-Washington route, runs across the foreground, south to the left.

The relaxing rural setting, an invitation for riding and hiking, is rich in woodland, affording ample cover and attractive hunting land all year round. Well-stocked streams near Lime Lake are a lure for all fishermen.

Location of Lime Lake, 40 miles south of Buffalo, makes it accessible to metropolitan areas of several states. Over 300 cottages surrounding the lake are used by vacationers, more each year becoming permanent residents of this resort area. Three hotels, several tourist homes and cabins in the lake vicinity have accommodations for vacationers.

In addition to swimming and fishing, the Lime Lake area provides facilities for canoeing, sailing, tennis, horseback riding, camping, boating, roller skating, amusement rides, miniature golf, dancing, water cycling, and several outstanding restaurants.



ODOSAGIH BIBLE CONFERENCE

A small group of ministers and laymen from seven different denominations in this region gathered in 1912 in what was known as Hazelmere Grove. This was the organization of the Odosagih Bible Conference. The first conferences were conducted only a few days each year until some years ago the time was increased to 15 days each session.

In 1927 the 23 acres at Lime Lake, including buildings, was purchased for \$13,000. This has been paid. About 10 acres of land and the Napier home were purchased in 1946. Thousands of dollars worth of equipment has been added during the years. The work has reached out in Youth Conference, Girls' Camp and Boys' Camp. This is not only a Christian Center for Odosagih, but other groups, as the American Sunday School Union, Bible Clubs, Christian Home League and Christian Missionary Alliance make use of the grounds.

Five or six other conferences throughout New York and Pennsylvania are the outgrowth of Odosagih. Great Bible teachers have brought inspiration to thousands of people and the churches of Western New York, Pennsylvania and Ohio have been greatly strengthened. This interdenominational work is carried on by free will offerings. Many missionaries are now in foreign fields who caught their vision at Odosagih.

Besides the meetings held in the spacious tabernacle, some of the most important are the groups of 100 to 200 gathered in devotional services about campfires in the woods. The hills, lake and wooded grounds give an ideal setting for recreational and spiritual atmosphere. Nearly every year a large number are baptized in the lake.

Founder, the Rev. John E. Whitney, Bloomsburg, Pa., has been president since the beginning of the Odosagih Bible Conference.

CATTARAUGUS COUNTY HOME AND FARM

The first Cattaraugus County poor home was established at Machias in 1835. In 1869, 225 persons were cared for there. Today the total has averaged 97 per year for the past ten years. During 1954 the Ladies' cottage was demolished.

The county home is still the center of county welfare activity. It provides facilities for domiciliary and infirmary care of the chronically ill, the aged, the infirm and those persons with failing mental faculties whose conditions do not warrant commitment to a mental hospital.

Aged and ambulatory chronically ill men are housed in a separate men's dormitory. The infirm and convalescent, about 80 per cent of those under care here, require active nursing care and have separate space.

The infirmary here meets inspection and approval for standards of medical service, nursing care, diet service, sanitation, safety and fire protection. Infirmary patients are under continuing medical and nursing care and serving of meals and nourishment. Improvements have been made to improve care of the chronically ill in the infirmary.

The county farm, which was operated for almost 100 years, was ordered closed by the County Board of Supervisors in the Spring of 1957. Its farm stock, equipment and tools were sold at public auction for approximately \$25,000 in April. One month later the farm proper was sold. Remaining county property for the farm was in the process of sale as this directory went to press.

In 1944 a quick freeze and refrigeration storage was installed and in 1951 a 40-quart ice cream freezer.

The problem of the aged and infirm is a continuing one. Improved medical science is extending the span of life and thus increasing the the proportion of aged persons in our population. In 1900 there were 3,000,000 persons 65 years of age and over in the United States. The number increased to 12,300,000 by 1950 and is rising annually.

The Commissioner of Public Welfare today is Hazard E. Robinson, who is resident at the home. He is responsible for the management of the home and land and for the care of its residents. He controls admissions and discharges of patients, appoints the attending staff and directs their work. Costs of welfare in the county require the largest share of the annual budget, and include gross expenses of maintenance and operation of the county home buildings and infirmary and the salaries of the institutional staff.

TO ALL COTTAGE OWNERS:

The aims of your directors are to improve conditions at Lime Lake so that all of us may have a more pleasant and enjoyable Summer.

We are confident that if you will just take a moment to evaluate the situation, you will realize that we can only promote the projects which are of a general nature, and from which a greater number of Association members may benefit.


The Association has no enforcement powers, and in establishing policies, we are limited to the extent of our judgement. The greater the participation of cottage owners in the affairs of the Association, the better we can serve you.

Your directors have established a very cordial relationship with the Town of Machias and Cattaugus County officials, who are cooperating in giving us many services and improvements, such as re-surfacing of Lake View Blvd. and better fire fighting service. The Machias Town Clerk now makes it possible to get boat licenses by mail. In 1955 your Association purchased an underwater weed cutter to combat the weed situation on Lime Lake. This entailed a large expense, but your directors felt this was justified to give more boating, fishing and swimming pleasure to all.

Your interest in the Association will be manifested by your attendance at the regular annual meeting Sunday, June 9, 1957, where you may state your problems, offer constructive criticism, and lend encouragement to those who are devoting their time and efforts in an endeavor to serve you.
